Dear colleagues –

You will no doubt be pleased to hear that publication of the CEGEA Bulletin 'Speleophant' has been resuscitated after many years absence, the last issue (Vol.6) appearing way back in 1982! Past issues have now become rare collector's items!

Over the years, a back-log of unpublished material and intended articles has been accumulated that will provide the basis for a series of annual issues starting with Volume 7, 2010, that is now ready for circulation. While some of the contents will be a bit dated, there are and will be articles covering original work in the caves of our region and those that reflect the historical and humorous side of CEGEA's exploratory activities over the years. Future editions are also expected to include a 'final' report on our great Leviathan Cave.

In addition, Clive Ward and I have put together a small, privately published, volume 'Guide to the Volcanic Caves of Kilimanjaro-Report on the Lava Tubes of Mawenzi' which basically summarises what is presently known about the caves on this mountain upon which further investigations can be based.
